Charles Henry Frenzel was born in October of 1946 in northern Minnesota to Betty and Fredrick Frenzel. Charles was the second oldest of 13 brothers and sisters and grew up on a dairy farm working alongside his family.

Charles is survived by his dedicated and loving wife of 33 years Mickie Frenzel in Magnolia TX, where they raised their son Andrew, who tragically preceded Charles in death in 2024 at the age of 31. Charles is survived by his children- Marlaine (Frenzel) Muylaert with husband-Dave Muylaert, Ervin Frenzel with wife-Misty Frenzel, Rebecca (Frenzel) Wierschke and husband-Greg Wierschke, and Crystal (Frenzel) Montgomery and husband-Jake Montgomery.

His death was preceded by 2 sons- Paul Frenzel and Andrew Frenzel- both were always in his thoughts and prayers.

Charles was an honest, hard worker, honorable, charitable and humble soul who served his communities and his family. He loved animals and rescued many dogs who were stranded by a canyon where he lived in Amarillo. Charles loved being active and good food. Charles also enjoyed visiting with others in the community and would often share tales of adventures with his family that he experienced when abroad on active duty. He served in the US Army Reserves for over 32 years and was actively deployed in Iraq, where he

contracted brain cancer. Charles worked for over 30 years with the Pantex Plant, USDOE Special Police Officer, carrying Top Secret clearance. He also served over 30 years as sergeant with the Potter County Sheriff Reserves and the Randall County Sheriff Reserves. Charles was active in the Amarillo Area Law Enforcement Lions Club, serving numerous Club and District Offices. Charles was active in the Knights of Columbus for many years, both in Amarillo and Magnolia. Charles served many offices with the American Legion Hanson Post 54, several years as Post Commander. He was an active servant of God with St. Joseph and St. Mary Cathedral Parishes in Amarillo, as well as St. Matthias Parish of Magnolia, where he was proud to be a St. Matthias Guard and a member of the Men's Club. He and his wife Mickie hosted international students over the years from Finland, Australia and Belgium, who sometimes returned to visit. Those that knew him, treasured the commendatory friendship he so selflessly offered.

Charles is well and truly loved and will be missed by his wife and children-dearly, as well as 13 brothers and sisters, 11 grandchildren, and 8 great-grandchildren as well as numerous nieces, nephews, and cousins.
