Gene Sandifer 95, of Houston, Texas passed away peacefully on Friday, February 23rd, 2024.

Gene was born in Louisiana to the late Bing and Sierra (Watson) Sandifer. Gene was the first member of his family to earn a college degree from Louisiana State University. He proudly served with distinction in the United States Army and was a veteran of the post-World War II Occupation forces and later the Korean War.

Gene had a long professional career beginning at Humble Oil and continuing with the integration of Humble Oil into Exxon Company USA. He retired from Exxon Mobil in 1993 after 40 years.

During his retirement Gene lived in Pawley's Island, SC. While living in South Carolina, he converted to Catholicism and was a communicant of Precious Blood parish. He was a driving force in the success of various food pantries (St. Vincent DePaul in Houston and the Outreach Farm in Pawleys Island, SC). Gene was an active fisherman and known for his famous Louisiana shrimp boils and fish fries, not to mention many a fried turkey during holiday times.

He was a lifelong friend to many and a well-respected mentor. He will be

sorely missed.

In addition to his parents, Gene was predeceased by his nine siblings and his son, Galen Sandifer. Gene is survived by his loving wife of 40 years, Rosemary (Baker) Sandifer, his daughter Beverly; son Gene (Sharon); his two stepsons: James McHugh (Annie), John McHugh (Coleen); and his cherished 15 grandchildren and 9 great-grandchildren, who affectionately called him, "PePa". He had numerous nieces, nephews and cousins who will miss him greatly.
