James (Jim) Carroll Towns went to be with his Lord on the morning of November 2, 2017 in The Woodlands, Texas at the age of 83.

He was a devoted husband and father and enjoyed cheering for his children and grandchildren in their extracurricular activities, such as sports, dance, plays, and choir. He was a Master Mason and a member of Velasco Lodge #757 for 58 years.

Jim was a member of First Baptist Church in Alvin Texas for 30 years and Heights Baptist Church also in Alvin, Texas for several years, Jersey Village Baptist Church in Jersey Village, Texas for a few years, and recently found a new church home at Second Baptist Church in Cypress, Texas.
