He always asked me about my day, and if I was meeting my sales goals at work. He expressed such genuine interest in all my achievements and all things important to me. He wanted to hear about my son and his business, and any updates on my granddaughter.

Johnny shared stories of his children and grandchildren and it was so apparent how much he loved them and how proud he was of all their accomplishments.

In our final chapter together, I was able to introduce him to my future husband, he had very high standards on how a man should treat a lady. I was so happy that he immediately liked him and told me how happy he was that I found a great guy to be happy with.
