“ Kelly Geohagan Changed My Life (and made me a better person)

I first met Kelly in 1982. I was on my way home (NJ) from a drive to Alaska. I had stopped in Houston to see my Uncle Joe, a family favorite of mine. He invited Cheri and Kelly to come over, and we would all eat dinner together.

Kelly could not stop looking at me. She was looking into my eyes, but I felt she was seeing and touching my heart. I had never thought that handicapped people had that ability. I actually felt love emanating from Kelly. Cheri was embarrassed by it, and asked me to sit next to Kelly. I figured that maybe Kelly wasn't able to turn her head 90 degrees. But she was, and she actually leaned towards me, touching me and looking at me. Again, I didn't think that handicapped people were capable of anything like that.

After we finished eating, Cheri asked me if I was spending the night. I told her that I was. She then asked me to come and stay with them. And, of course I said yes.

At there home, I met Tim. He welcomed me. But it was more like Kelly and me. Kelly seemed happy that I was there. It was more relaxed there. I stayed for 2 or 3 more days. I was just amazed by how Kelly was making me feel. It was like she reached inside of me, opened my heart, and awakened something inside of me. I started thinking that maybe all people have this inside of them. One just has to make them feel relaxed enough to let it out. So, I began to start trying to do that.

When I got home, I got a job working with handicapped adults, and then with handicapped children. I worked on making them feel good about themselves. Five years later, I became a New York City school teacher. I brought that ability with me to my classroom. And I LOVED teaching and being in the classroom with the kids.

One of my former students, wrote a note about me on Facebook the other day. She mentioned how good she felt in my classroom, and that I had made her feel that she could do anything that she really wanted to do.

Thank You Kelly. I love you and miss you, and will always love. You made me a better person.
