Lenard “Len” Jackson Miller born June 16, 1941 to Ira Franklin and Metta Vienna (Sitze) Miller in Grassy, MO, Bolinger County passed from this life and was welcomed into the next by his ancestors at his home in Magnolia, TX on June 29, 2020.

Len deemed himself a risk taker in life creating quite the resume for himself in his 79 years. As a youth he worked hard on the family farm in Southeast Missouri. He spent his adult career as a Baptist Pastor, high school teacher, and eventually spent the peak of his career in corporate America. The highlight of his career was working as CEO of Sunshine Jr., dedicating himself to successfully turn the company around. Len obtained his Bachelor’s degree in History with a minor in Political Science and Psychology from Ouachita Baptist University in 1970. Len was provided many travel opportunities in his lifetime including the ability to retire to Ecuador in 2003 where he met the love of his life Jeannine. They were united in marriage November 17, 2007. In addition to his three biological children Len raised Jeannine’s three sons as his own.

Len joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints in 1972, serving others in many callings throughout his membership. He shared his testimony with others of Jesus Christ and the teachings of the gospel in any moment he was given to do so. Len was solid in his knowledge of these things and held gratitude for his Baptist beginnings. Although he never served an official church mission, his time in Ecuador was some of the happiest in his life as he

served the Lord through daily service of his fellow man.

Len lived a good life as a great story teller, student of everything, and teacher to all with a pure patriotic American pride mixed with genuine Texas pride that only Texans can know. He was afforded so many opportunities and touched numerous lives in his 79 years. We are so grateful he lived this life and carry on his legacy as we continue to follow his guidance and example.

Len is survived by his deeply loved wife Jeannine F. Miller, his three children Christy Link (Jim), L. Matthew Miller (Casey Schnack), and Ashley Akhtar (Kamal). He is also survived by his stepsons whom he viewed as his own sons Victor Zambrano, Jair Barberán, and Bryan Barberán. He is survived by his grandchildren who loved him as “Boots”, S. Miller, Pierman, Emery Link, Quincy, Asher, Kassius, C. Lennox Miller, and Vienna Akhtar. Len is also survived by his loving siblings D. Zeldean Munton, and Chester Miller (Susan). 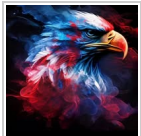

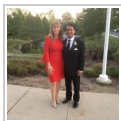
