Lois Suttles Snead passed from this life to eternal life on Monday, August 31, 2020 in Tomball, Texas at the age of 97. She was a resident of Baytown, Texas for 66 years.

Born in Rochester, Texas to Joe and Iva Suttles, she met and married Bill Snead in the summer of 1951. Together, they made their life, and many sweet memories, in Baytown.

Lois taught first as a classroom teacher and then as a librarian for 39 years. She served as a librarian at Robert E. Lee High School, Horace Mann Junior High, and Ross Sterling High School. Throughout their years in Baytown, Lois and Bill served in many ways at Missouri Street Church of Christ and in several community service organizations. She was happiest when helping others. Her true calling, she believed, was to teach women about glorifying and serving the Lord. She taught a ladies' Bible class for over four decades.
