Mark, age 59, of Pinehurst, Texas, went to be with the Lord on Friday, December 16th, 2022. Mark was born in Sidney, Nebraska to Ann (Watson) Satterwhite and Gerald Rogers. He graduated from Dulles High School in Sugar Land in 1981.

After graduation, Mark entered the United States Navy and served for four years. Then he attended the University of Houston where he was a member of the Sigma Nu fraternity.

Mark met Pamela, the love his life, while attending university and they married on November 10th, 1990.

Mark and Pamela made their home in Pinehurst, Texas in 1994 where they currently reside. Their first son, Mark Anthony Rogers II, joined the family in January 1995. Their second son, Sean Micah Rogers, completed the family in October 1998.

Mark was preceded in death by his father, Gerald Rogers, and his grandparents J.D. and Mildred Watson, Grace Watson, and Anna Borm Paddock.

Mark's first word was "car". He loved working on his first car, a Chevy Chevette, when he turned 16. That love of cars continued throughout his lifetime. There is still a vehicle awaiting restoration in the barn. He enjoyed working on cars and other projects with his best friend, David Orr.

Mark loved to cook. He made his Grandma Mildred an Easter bunny cake when he was 10. This love of cooking also stayed with him all his life.

Mark was a member of Graceview Baptist Church where he previously served as a Deacon, worked in the Youth Ministry as part of the youth worship band, and was part of the choir. He also served as a Den Leader and then Cubmaster for Cub Scout Pack 794. Later, he served as Assistant Scoutmaster and then Scoutmaster for Boy Scout Troop 41. Both sons were involved in scouting and he had the pleasure of seeing them become Eagle Scouts.

Mark's favorite band was Rush and he loved playing guitar. A favorite pastime of his was going to University of Houston football games with Pamela, and playing with his dogs, Sugar and Silas. Computers were his specialty and he

built a career in the IT industry where he was currently employed at World Wide Technology.
