Maximino Piñon, age 50 of Waller, Texas passed away August 17th, 2022 unexpectedly after an agency-approved fitness activity. Max was born in Mexico to his parents Josefina and Jose Guadalupe Piñon on February 14th, 1972. Max lived in many different states growing up, but always found his way home to Waller/Hempstead Texas. Max was a true Warrior, a symbol of Valor and Strength. An “Aztec”, as he would say. Max enlisted in the United State Marine Corps in 1991 shortly after graduating from Hempstead High School, being the first of his family to truly set out on his own. While in the Marine Corps, he volunteered himself to be stationed in Okinawa, Japan for 3 of his 4-year contract as a Combat Engineer. Shortly after his time in the Corps, he enrolled at Blinn Junior College in Brenham, Texas where he would begin as a History Major, hoping to be a high school teacher and baseball coach. Two years later, he transferred to Sam Houston State University; One Criminal Justice Class later, his whole degree plan changed. During his time in school, he took on a job with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice in 1995, and would work Full Time, while also fitting in 15 hours of school every semester, taking night classes until his graduation in December of 2000. Shortly after his graduation, He had his first daughter, Alexis Piñon, and applied to the U.S Customs and Border Patrol. In 2001, he would set off for 8 months to his first federal job training, and would soon be working in Kingsville, Texas. In 2003, Max applied to the United States Marshal Service and would become a vital member of the Gulf Coast Violent Offenders & Fugitive Task Force. He loved

the opportunities he was given by the Marshal's Service, and held his badge with much pride, humility, strength, and valor. Max was known to be a central point of contact and was capable of treating each and every person with respect and dignity. In 2007, he welcomed his second daughter Sarah Piñon, and would become the best father, mentor, and idol to both of his daughters. He would fall in love with the world of fitness, and enjoyed running Spartan races with his daughter Sarah. As well as the tradition of Astros games with both of his daughters. Max also held his gym family very close to him as well, Lonestar Breakout would become one of his favorite past times. Max is survived by his two daughters, Alexis and Sarah Piñon, and their mother Kimberly Keenum-Piñon, as well as their family pup, Addy. He is also survived by his Parents, Josefina and Jose Piñon, as well as his five siblings: Ida Piñon-Jasinski (Jimmy Jasinski), Claudia Piñon Alvarez (Anthony Alvarez), Gabe Piñon (Jerri Paradise van Wunnik), Erik Piñon (Fransheska R.
