Mickey Ray Theeck, age 79, the youngest son of J.D. and Marie Theeck, entered into God's eternal presence on August 6, 2025. He was born at Heights Hospital in Houston, Texas.

Mickey was baptized at Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church (Neudorf Community, Cypress, TX) now a part of the Tomball Museum Center. He was confirmed on June 3, 1962. Mickey was a longtime faithful member of Zion Lutheran Church in Tomball.

Mickey attended Tomball schools and was a proud member of the Tomball High School Class of 1964. He attended and supported THS sporting events knowing the majority of the athletes and, in most cases, their parents and grandparents. He was the "biggest and #1 fan" of all THS athletic events. Mickey was presented with an Honorary letter jacket by the Tomball Athletic Booster Club.

Mickey was a virtual living encyclopedia of knowledge concerning the history of Tomball and the surrounding areas. His ability to connect family trees was unmatched.

Mickey was definitely a '60's child who loved Marilyn Monroe. Throughout his later years, he declared his love for Zydeco music and travelled many places

to listen to live bands and danced the night away. He loved to cook and was known for his peach cobbler and banana pudding. His crawfish and shrimp etouffee will surely be missed at future family gatherings.

Mickey retired from DHL where he was a collections agent. At DHL, he collected duty owed by foreign companies doing business with U.S. companies.

Mickey was preceded in death by his parents J.D. and Marie Theeck of Tomball; his brothers Bubba Theeck of Tomball and Jimmy Theeck of Brenham; as well as Mickey's nephew, Shannon Theeck, of Brenham.
