Norma Jane Dotson enjoyed the moment she had lived her entire life for when she met Jesus face to face after her death on April 13, 2021 in Abilene, TX. Born in Houston, TX on June 8, 1929, to Louis H. and Eva Peters (deceased), she was a graduate of Reagan High School. Norma was known for her beautiful alto voice, and sang in the glee club in high school, and also at many church functions. She enjoyed writing, bird watching and nature in general, but most of all, she was a devoted follower of Jesus Christ and displayed a missionary zeal in sharing her faith. Norma lived at various times in Houston, TX; Spring, TX; Magnolia, TX and Abilene, TX. She loved her children with all her heart, as well as her grandchildren. She was famous for her large spreads at holiday meals, with her specialties being chicken and dumplings and banana pudding. Her life spanned a great deal of history, being born just months before the stock market crash of October 1929, and in a year when Babe Ruth led the league in home runs. She always endeavored to stay up with developments, and was fond of her I-Pad and I-Phone, even at age 91. Norma was preceded in death by her husbands, Ernest B. Dotson, Jr. and Doyle D. Hicks. She was also preceded in death by a daughter, Donna Stone and her husband, G. Terry Stone; and by her sister Betty Mize. She is survived by her two sons: E.B.
