And anyone who knew Romy knew he had a little spark of adventure — and just enough mischief to keep things interesting. Whether he was trying something new, stirring the pot with a perfectly timed comment, or finding his own way of doing things, he brought a spirit that made life around him a little less predictable and a lot more memorable.

Romy leaves behind a legacy built on presence, laughter, and the countless ways he touched the people around him. He will be deeply missed, forever remembered, and always loved.
