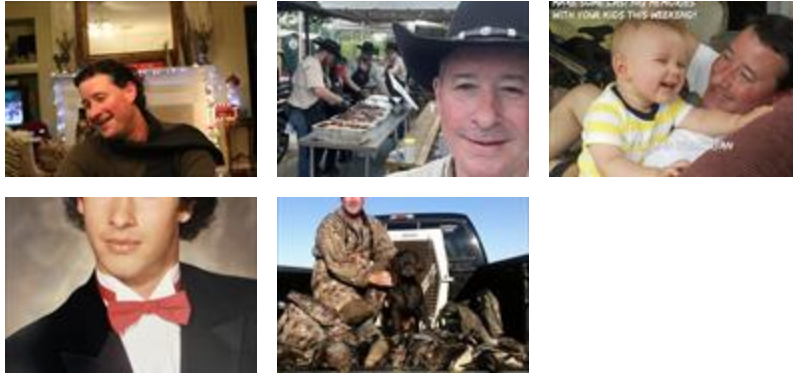
The most important thing I will ever remember is his unquestionable love of his son. Never a conversation was had that he did not bring him up.

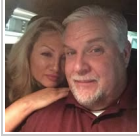

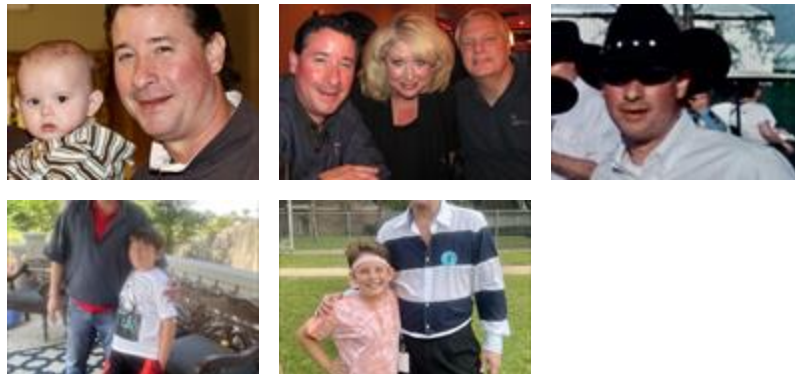
