She would go to ACU's Bible Teacher Workshop in the summers and learn new ways to better teach her babies. Vicki was dedicated to the ministry of teaching little ones. Vicki worked at MDO at Tomball Church of Christ and taught an 18-month old class at Northland for many years. After retiring, Vicki got down to the important thing for her, travelling more with Jeff. They travelled all over the United States with some occasional jumps up into Canada, seeing national parks, friends, family, and enjoying life together. After the passing of Jeff in 2018, Vicki didn't slow down. She continued to travel. During this time Vicki also worked at Lydia's Pantry. She would type her cards on Tuesdays and do her job on Wednesdays, always making sure that she found coverage for when she would be gone visiting friends and family or travelling. In 2020 after 60+ years of wondering, Vicki located and found her birth mother and family. This led to her speaking with her aunt Gloria for the first time in the summer of 2020. In September of 2022, Vicki was invited to surprise her aunt for her 80th birthday party and travelled to Indiana to meet her birth family for the first time. During this trip she met two aunts and a ton of cousins. She enjoyed family so much and the Gray family welcomed her in with open arms. Vicki continued to search for her birth father and after finally discovering her birth father's family she gained 8 siblings. Vicki had a great facetime call with her siblings and then in May of 2023 she was able to meet her brother, two sisters, a nephew, and niece. The Larmon family was just as welcoming to her. Vicki loved her newly found family so much so she had planned a trip, just a couple of months ago to visit all of them again. Vicki loved life and kept going and doing as long as she could. She never let cancer get in the way of her living life to the fullest.
